



SCHINDLER'S LIST ON THE PRAIRIE:

European Refugees in America's Heartland, 1939-43

From 1939 to 1943, 185 refugees from Nazi-occupied Europe found refuge at Scattergood Hostel, in what had been a Quaker boarding school in Iowa.
